Applications

Siesta has a wide range of uses, from golf course roughs to parks and home lawns. For permanent turf it performs best at 11/2" to 3", but is adapted to mowing heights as low as 1/2". Siesta performs well alone or in mixtures with Jacklin bluegrasses or fine fescues in temperate and transition zone climates.

Specifications

Seeding and establishment may be done in spring or fall, but be weary of summer or winter annuals. For better early weed control, consider an application of Me-sotrione in the seeding process. Plant seeds to a depth of no more than 0.25-0.50" below the soil surface to ensure good seed to soil contact. Thatch layers will only slow or impede germination success. After spreading seed, keep seedbed moist throughout germination, with extra care during the early stages to prevent seed from drying out after initial seed imbibition. Germination should begin within 7 to 14 days and be complete within 21 days. The stand should establish in 30 days. Remember, the full turfgrass establishment process may take 6 months to a year.
