Applications

Triple A is a three way blend of top performing Jacklin turf-type tall fescues which is perfect for a wide range of turfgass applications. Its deep root system provide great heat and drought tolerance allowing Triple A to stand up against stress commonly found in non-irrigated areas on golf courses, sports fields, parks and other community areas. Triple A quick germination and establishment provide ease of mind and great performance for those high demand home lawns and elite playing fields. With excellent traffic tolerance, Triple A can take some punishment and recover well.

Specifications

Seeding and establishment may be done in spring or fall, but be weary of summer or winter annuals. For better early weed control, consider an application of Me-sotrione in the seeding process. Plant seeds to a depth of no more than 0.25-0.50" below the soil surface to ensure good seed to soil contact. Thatch layers will only slow or impede germination success. After spreading seed, keep seedbed moist throughout germination, with extra care during the early stages to prevent seed from drying out after initial seed imbibition. Germination should begin within 7 to 14 days and be complete within 21 days. The stand should establish in 30 days. Remember, the full turfgrass establishment process may take 6 months to a year.
